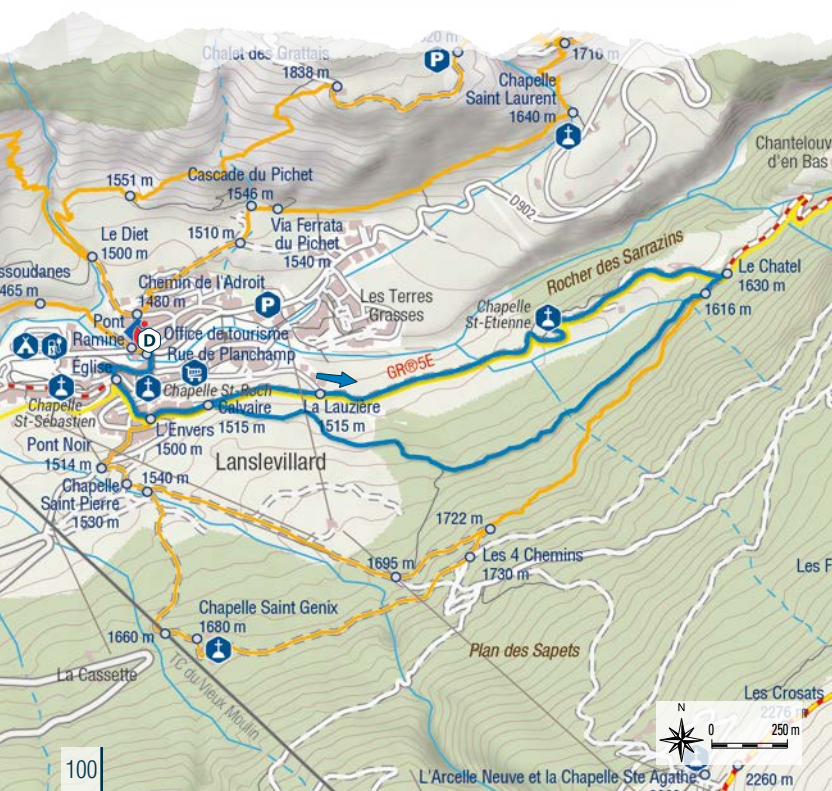
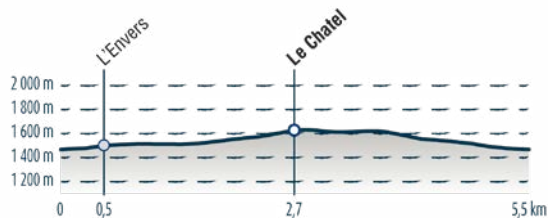


Access to start point

Parking nearby.

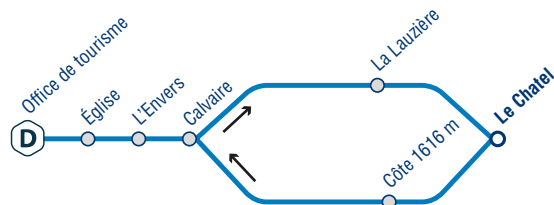
