

VINSORRES

Located on a hill - between 180 meters low and more than 500 meters high-Vinsobres is a welcoming provençal village with a mild climate. Thanks to the numerous vestiges collected on the fields, we know that the Roman people occupied the area. From then, the village lived in prosperity. Later on, by 970, nuns from the Nyons Prieuré settled down in Vinsobres and managed the goods of the village. They belonged to the Saint Cesair abbey of Arles. Due to its economic activity and faith in God, the village turned into a very important Huguenot fiefdom - a great part of the inhabitants having turned their minds to the new ideas of the reform. That is how Vinsobres became a protestant fortress: one of the secured place for the Réformés by the

Edit of Nantes (1598). Nowadays, the village of Vinsobres has more than 1150 inhabitants. And, even if vineyards and olive trees have always fought for the local supremacy, viticulture is now the fleuron of its economy. The well-known Cru of Vinsobres has built the village's reputation miles away.



he starting point of the treasure hunt is located at the Tourist Board. As soon as you get out of the Board entrance, reach the opposite parking lot. From there, you can discover the ironed sculpture on top of the Board building 0, as well as the olive tree made for the "La Semaine du Goût" ('One Week for Tasting') 2. Take Gironde Street until you reach the church square 60. Walk up on the left side of the church to reach the temple, and make a stop at the big porch 4. Pass underneath the porch and, at the crossroad, leave Grand'rue Street and go straight ahead. Take the stairs on your left (passage of the Knight Templars) and keep walking. You are at the temple 6. Walk along the temple, on the right side, and climb the little rise on your right just after. Keep walking until you reach the two pines standing on your left, and take Jeu de Paume Street on the left. Halt in front of the n°1 door 6. Go down the street on your right and, at the crossroad, keep going down on your left direction Venterol. Make a stop at St Botin Fountain and Washing place • Go back up to the crossroad and look for the hidden cross 19. Walk up on your right just before the cross, and keep walking on Grand'rue Street (admire La Tour de Paris on your right, and the Vinsobres vineyards on your left) Reach Centenary Square and go down on your left. At the crossroad, take Grand'rue Street on your left until the arcade. Keep going down to reach the church and go back to the Tourist Board by Gironde Street. Now you may ask for your «treasure"! The Church

After the Revocation of the Edit de Nantes (1685), most of the Protestants were forced to convert to Catholicism. The church (in fact, the present temple) then becoming too small, the King decided to build another one; its edification started in 1685 and was completed in 1710. The Catholic worship was only celebrated there by 1712 since the bishop feared the condemnation of the 'new Catholics'. The church was blessed in 1713. A magnificent luster from the 17th century is located inside (ask for the key at the Tourist Board).

La Traverse des Templiers / The Knight Templars Passage

The Order of the Templars was founded in 119 in Jerusalem. In 1136, these warrior monks settled in Richerenches - a nearby village - one of the most important commandery in Provence. Later on, they spread in the surroundings, in particular in the village of Vinsobres where they founded a "Maison".



The Temple (former 12th century Priory)

What a jewel of the Vinsobres heritage! Over time, the Temple was used as Priory, Catholic Church, and finally temple of the Reformed Church, so that it was exceptionally placed at the top of the village (ask for the key at the Tourist Board).


















