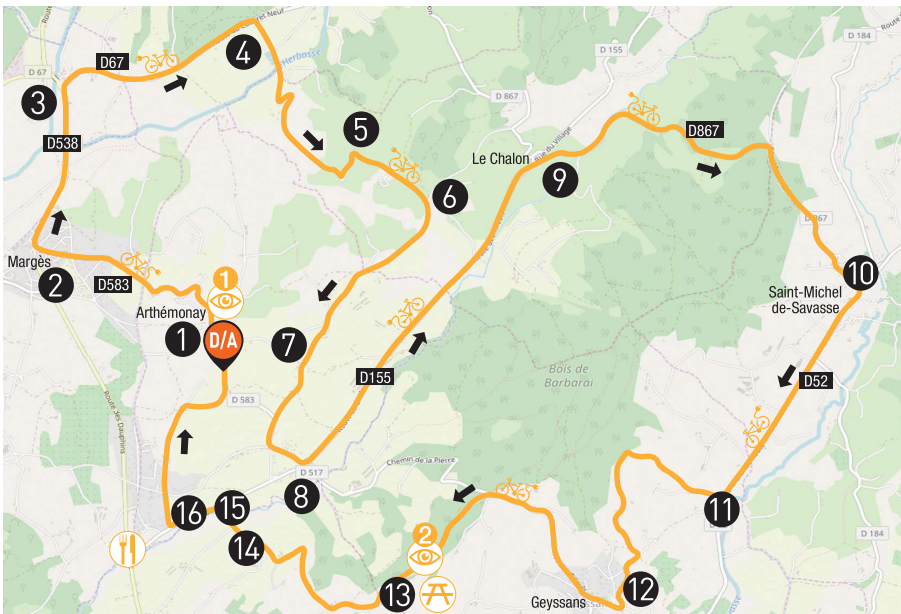
CHALON VALLEY [ARTHÉMONAY]

On the secret and pleasant roads discover, round every bend, different landscapes, all with the same beauty. Here and there unexpected monuments worth the detour for contemplating.

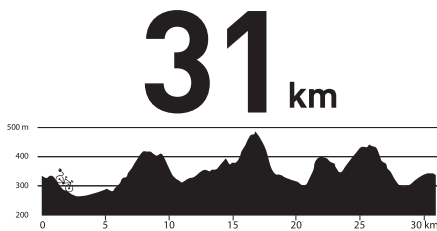
Look out for

ROADBOOK

- 1 **0 km** From the village take the D583 to Margès.
- 2 **1,8 km** In the village turn right onto the D538 "route d'Hauterives".
- 3 **3,3 km** At the roundabout turn right onto the D67 towards Crépol.
- 4 **5,1 km** Turn right onto "route des Combes".
- 5 **7,3 km** Continue on the "route des Biards".
- 6 **8,1 km** Turn right onto "route des Crêtes".
- 7 **9,9 km** Leave "route des crêtes" turning left onto the small road.
- 8 **11 km** In Reculais turn left onto the D155 and continue to Le Chalon.
- 9 **14,3 km** In the village turn right onto the D867 to Saint-Michel-de-Savasse.
- 10 **18,3 km** When you get to St-Michel turn right onto the D52 signed up Génissieux.
- 11 **20,4 km** Turn left onto "route de Desviage" and continue to Geyssans.
- 12 **23,4 km** Go through the village and follow the signs "Saint-Ange" to the hilltop church.
- 13 **26,1 km** Continue on the road to St-Ange.
- 14 **27,9 km** Turn right towards "gué de Morteveille".
- 15 **28,2 km** Turn left onto "route de l'Arberge".
- 16 **28,6 km** Turn first right returning to Arthémonay.

1 ARTHEMONAY CHURCH : The 11th-century Roman church is a little wonder with its huge bell-tower and windows "géménées" meaning in pairs, along with the beautiful woodwork in the choir.

2 SAINTE-ANGE CHAPEL IN PEYRINS : On the hilltop of the hamlet of the same name, the small church of Sainte-Ange priory is an invitation to daydreaming when you hear its name. However, the panoramic view of the impressive Vercors mountains brings you back to reality.



PICNIC CORNER : A well-chosen stopping point to contemplate : Sainte-Ange chapel is like a sentry facing the Vercors barrier.

A LITTLE BONUS

Hilly Drôme carries its name well. With their soft curves, the hills each hide a small stream in their hollow.
