Along the way

Do you know the names of the five forts that make up the impressive Barrière de l'Esseillon?

The most accessible just a short walk away. Warmed by the sun, enjoy a magical moment under the Saint-Benoit waterfall. Miraculously springing from the rock face, this gigantic 90-metre-tall mist sprayer is a popular place to cool off. The chapel of the same name, set in a low-altitude alpine meadow, is one of the best viewpoints overlooking the valley. It was formerly a pilgrimage site.

Back in the village, take the time to discover the flamboyant baroque art of St. Thomas Becket Church.

Set off in the footsteps of Private Alessandro, in the spectacular grounds of Fort Victor Emmanuel. How about a fun treasure hunt with your family? Make your way through the winding paths of a historic site packed with surprises and secrets.



Along the way

With a backpack filled with precious items and a booklet of games, go back to 1840 for an adventure in the footsteps of Private Alessandro. Built in the early nineteenth century by Sardinians to protect themselves from French invasions, this imposing fortress has many puzzles for you to solve before it'll yield up its secrets. The stones still whisper stories about the soldiers who lived there, killing... time!

The little extra

Head to the Aussois tourist office to obtain your gear.

Access is free of charge for walkers who want to visit the fort independently, without playing the game. Follow the giant leaves to discover all kinds of valuable information about the site.
