## Sahune

Be careful! Several paths are stony and slippery depending on the weather. Please put appropriate shoes on so that you can enjoy the tour properly.

According to the legend, the name of the village would come from its founder who shouted, seeing his prosper city, "assez d'une"! (meaning "one is enough") This locution became, over time and due to deformation, SAHUNE. The village is at the heart of the Regional and natural park of the provençales Baronnies. Dominated by the Coucou Mount and the Bramard Rock (emblematic rock whom Sphinx head and carvings bellow in the wind), the village is crossed by the river l'Eygues. Do not miss the

numerous silver-colored olive trees on the right bank of the river. Actually, Sahune

is composed of two villages: the modern village along the river and the old village on its promontory, on the other side of the river (where you are). Indeed, in the middle of the 19th c., the whole valley was opened up thanks to the construction of a road linking Sahune to the village of Rémuzat. The creation of this road caused a displacement of the population towards the river, at the foot of the village.



The starting point of the treasure hunt is located at the top of the old village, right at the cross • Follow the direction of the orientation table, then make a halt in front of the botanical path information panel • and keep walking until you reach the bread oven • 20 meters further, take the stairs on your right leading to the 17th century church. Stay in front of the church gate to solve another enigma •

Get out of the church by the lateral door, turn left and go opposite, then turn right to walk along the fruit trees until you reach the entrance of the castle . Follow the dirt track to reach the orientation table .

Look in the direction of the Baridier (located on the orientation table) to find the path "retour village" (return to the modern village). Follow the path, and be careful while descending. When you arrive at a crossing of tree tracks, turn right. Pass behind the oven and take the stairs down on your left. Cross the road to go opposite on the grassy path and discover the jeu de paume, located just after the house, on your left **0**.

Move backward to take Rue de l'Ecole (School street) on your right. Keep walking and make a halt when you reach the road, then turn over to watch the human-like mountain <sup>(3)</sup>

Take the road back to reach the cross and end the tour.

#### A bit of history

According different sources, both written and archeological, one can affirm that the site of Sahune has been occupied by men since pre-history: presence of flints, round stones, potteries...

The stele dedicated to the Mastrae (Goddess Mothers) during the Gallic period confirms the importance of this site. Several marks of Roman roads have also been discovered, one of which led to the old village of Sahune and another

one to the village of Villeperdrix.

Fragments of terra sigillata potteries and coins are also found, testifying of a sedentary Gallo-Roman occupation.

During the Middle Ages, the territory was divided between a priory located near the river and the "castrum" settled on the heights – a village widened and strengthened at the foot of this latter. The first mention of the castle dates certainly back from 1142. It was charged and devastated many times during the religious wars, destroyed during the reign of Richelieu, restored in 1762 and once again devastated in 1792. Today, most part of the ramparts have disappeared. Only a few vestiges of a glorious past remain, such as a circular ten meters high tower, probably representing a donjon.

The Saint Michel Chapel, which was part of the entirely restored fortified ensemble, is now a private propriety.

Worth noting: Sahune was a village of shoemakers until the end of the last century. 75 shoemakers were recorded in 1880 working in various workshops, and only 2 in 1920.

The blue figure indicates the number of the line, and the black figure indicates the position of the letter in the line.
