# Sur les chemins de la Clairette ...

#### **AOC Clairette de Die**


Clairette de Die is the most widely known and the oldest of all the AOCs in the Diois : it obtained the appellation in 1942. Muscat grape (75 % minimum) and Clairette grape (25% maximum) variety are used to produce this sparkling wine.


#### AOC Crémant de Die

This dry white sparkling wine is produced using the Clairette grape variety, the aligoté and muscat grapes are also part of its composition. An AOC since 1993, it is produced in accordance with the traditional method, with an initial fermentation in the vat and a second one in the bottle.

### AOC Coteaux de Die

This still, dry white wine is produced using 100% clairette grapes. In common with the Crémant, it obtained its AOC appellation in 1993.





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# ... Au Pays de la Gervanne

### Height difference +/- 40 m / age > 4 years old / time 45 minutes

The Gervanne river gives its name to this trail. You are on the village of **Suze** in the North-East of the Drôme valley on the Vercors Foothills. This trail begins on the foot of the Saint Pancrace mountain (735m). You can see a landscape of valleys in which the vines make up the majority of the cultivated land, and magnificent panoramic viewpoints over the Gervanne or the Saoû massif... Near to the Drôme valley, the trail goes below the vines to the ancient village. In front of you, a little farther, you can see the cliffs of the Plan-de-Baix and Ansage. The chalky argilliferous soil of the Peylong slopes or the chalky scree-covered and marly slopes below the old village are particularly suitable for the cultivation of vines.



#### And not far away ...

Mirabel-et-Blacons - An old village perched The Crest Tower - The highest donjon in France. The gorges of Omblèze and the Druise waterfall.



## **Itinerary of the Trail**

### **Starting point :**

From Crest, go up the D936 for 7km to Mirabel-et-Blacons. At the corner of a coffee shop, take the D70 in the direction of Beaufort-sur-Gervanne for 2km then, on the left, the D70A which leads you to Suze-sur-Crest in 4,5km. Go past the iron cross next to which the Jaillance sales outlet is indicated, then continue for another 400m, to park in the parking lot at the entrance to Suze-sur-Crest, in front of the Drôme hiking information board.
