# 2 Being accompanied

by mountain professionals

# 3 Hiking maps

If you want to be independent, **prepare your route** with **hiking maps or guidebooks** available at our tourist office or specialized stores; also, plan your round-trip walking time.

#### 8 Recommended equipment

Wear appropriate clothing for your outing **based on the season and the weather forecast**, and plan for **multiple layers and changes** of clothes (rain gear, warm clothing, windbreaker). Sturdy shoes with good soles, **walking sticks**, water, snacks (cereal bars, dried fruits), sunglasses, sunscreen, cap or hat, a fully charged mobile phone + external battery (solar recommended), a small **first aid kit**, an **IGN map** of the area.

# 9 Safety

Start early for cooler temperatures and parking availability. If you're hiking alone, inform your loved ones and **share your itinerary**. Leave a note on your car windows with date and time of departure and location of the hike.

For emergency services: call **112**, and if the network is poor, use 114 (send an SMS).

# 10 Marked routes

Always **follow marked routes**. Even if a path seems passable but is not indicated on the map and unmarked, it could be dangerous and used by wild animals.
