3* WALK TO THE WINERY

Discover the vats, barrels, and winemaking secrets of the estate.



4* WALK TO THE OLIVE MILL

Passing through the orangery and the century-old oak tree, symbol of the estate.



5* ARRIVAL AT THE OLIVE MILL

Discovery of the contemporary architecture and presentation of our olive groves.”



6* IMMERSION INSIDE THE OLIVE MILL

From olive to oil: Crushing, malaxation, decantation, centrifugation, and filtration.



7* RETURN THROUGH THE ARTWORKS & VINEYARDS

Discover artworks by Franck STELLA and Lionel SABATTÉ, alongside vineyard landscapes.



8* FINAL TASTING AT THE WINE CELLAR

Tasting of our extra virgin olive oils and our wines (white, rosé, red, and sparkling). Conversation and sharing.

Together, they envisioned Panéry as a living estate where vineyards, olive groves, architecture, and contemporary art exist in perfect harmony.

Once an ancient agricultural land rich in history, the estate has gradually transformed into a sensitive and inspiring place, where every stone, every tree, and every landscape carries emotion.

Today, Panéry stretches across hundreds of hectares of preserved landscapes, between vineyards, olive groves, and Mediterranean garrigue.

A Domain Inhabited by Art

In addition to the exhibitions presented in our two galleries, in partnership with Ceysson & Bénétière; The estate's permanent collection features monumental artworks scattered throughout the landscape. They transform a simple walk into an open-air artistic experience.

Among them:

The Owl Series (2022–2025), Lionel SABATTÉ

True guardians of the Estate, these sculptures were created on site and inspired by the cycles of living things.

Praise of Discretion (2012), Philippe RAMETTE
A work balancing absurd poetry and silent contemplation.

Frank's Wooden Star I (2024), Frank STELLA
Among the artist's final works, a true contemporary jewel suspended between geometry and chaos.

The Ancestors of the Future (2023), Gloria FRIEDMANN
A reflection on time, memory, and future generations.

Beam with Bottle Caps (2020), Noël DOLLA
A playful and minimalist assemblage using everyday materials, rhythm, color, and collective memory.

Tokyo Bay (2010), Aurélie PÉTREL
A photograph poised between image and architecture, where perception, space, and shifting viewpoints become unsettled.

The Pirate (2011), *The Acrobat XVII (2019)*, *Floating Profile XI – Floating Profile XII (2021)*, Bernard PAGÈS
Remarkable feats by the sculptor, balancing strength and lightness through a dialogue between steel, stone, and movement in space.

The Wooden Colossi, Christian LAPIE
Monumental figures in charred wood, deeply rooted and commanding.
