5 Rue de Loutraz. Parking nearby.

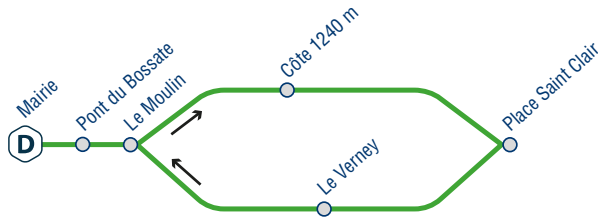


Scan and follow the route with your favourite app

Verney Circuit



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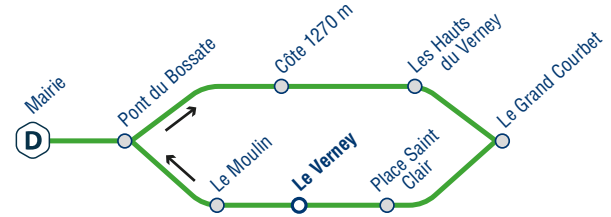


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In the intimacy of Bramans' narrow alleyways
