


THE PLANARDS [CROZES HERMITAGE]

The Wine Route

In the heart of the famous vineyards hillsides climb a little to discover stunning views.

Q Look out for

Chapel, viewpoint, vineyards, castle.



ROADBOOK

- 1 0 km From the church turn right onto the road leading to the Rhône Valley.
- 2 1 km Turn right onto the small road straight after the bridge under the railway line.
- 3 2,4 km At the stop sign turn right to enter Gervans.
- 4 2,8 km Turn right towards "route des belvédères".
- **5 5,8 km** At "les Planards" turn right and head for "belvederes des Méjeans and Pierre Aiguilles".
- 6,2 km Turn right at the giveway sign.
- 7 6,4 km Turn right onto "route des vins".
- 8 7,3 km Turn left at the stop sign onto route des Méjeans".
- 9 8,3 km Turn right onto "route d'Erôme".
- 10 8,7 km Turn right at the stop sign towards "Larnage"
- 10,9 km Turn right onto "route des Côtes-de-Meyer'

- 11,3 km Turn right onto "route des Charrets"
- 13 12,6 km Turn left onto the tourist route.
- 12,9 km Turn left towards the "bélvedere de Pierre Aiguille" as far as Crozes.
- 15,1 km Turn left when arriving in Crozes onto the "route du Creux-de-Saillat".
- 17,8 km Turn right onto "chemin de l'homme"
- 18,2 km Turn right onto "chemin de Fougearets" continue to the "belvedere de Pierre Aiguille".
- 19.9 km Continue to Hermitage chapel (road then path).
- 19 20,6 km Walk down the pebbled path below the chapel then turn left onto the side-path further on becoming a road.
- 21,6 km Return to Crozes.







1 CASTLE OF LARNAGE: Make a stop at these castle ruins, off the beaten track, in the middle of vines, offering an ideal place to enjoy the surroundings.

2 PIERRE AIGUILLE VIEWPOINT : Dare to climb the ridge and take off to fly over the Rhône Valley (viewpoint for migrating hirds

3 HERMITAGE CHAPEL AND HILLSIDE: The road turns into a path then what a surprise, when you come to a narrow passage between 2 walls and discover a cute, tiny chapel overlooking the King of Rivers.



PICNIC CORNER: On the edge of a vineyard, on the hill going up to Gervans, what better place for lunch overlooking the Rhône river.
